





First Regional allocates \$3-M to Scholarship Programme

eventeen G-SAT and Tertiary level students have been awarded scholarships, bursaries and book grants by First Regional Cooperative Credit Union for the school year, beginning this September.

The 2013 scholarship allocation totals \$3-million and represents a significant increase over the amount earmarked last year to support First Regional's Education programme. The number of tertiary level bursaries has also been increased from four to five.

Addressing parents and students at a ceremony to present the prizes, Board Member, Rev. Dr. Glenroy Lalor said the Credit Union's decision to increase its Education funding and tertiary level bursaries reflects its widened focus beyond St. Mary and St. Ann, to embrace tourism workers and their children islandwide.

The five tertiary level undergraduates have each received a bursary valued at \$200,000. This will allow them to pursue studies in Veterinary Medicine, Science, Medicine, and Computer Studies at universities throughout the island and at St. Augustine, Trinidad.


