FIRST REGIONAL GOES ISLANDWIDE

irst Regional Co-operative Credit Union Ltd. has merged with two smaller credit unions in the hospitality industry in a strategic move which will see First Regional expanding its scope of operations island-wide as of July 1, 2013.

Approval of the merger came at First Regional's 35th Annual General Meeting held Saturday June 8 at the Jewel Runaway Bay Hotel, in St. Ann, and attended by some 400 members. The AGM also approved resolutions allowing First Regional to expand its remit in order to meet the needs of its new members in the hospitality industry throughout the island.

In his report to the AGM, President Hopeton Henry said First

Regional's performance in 2012 had surpassed many of its targets for the year, with the Credit Union achieving an 8% growth in Total Assets; and a healthy surplus of \$85.55-million while expanding its membership base by 8.15%.

We look forward to expanding our membership base even more, and are currently putting in place the various elements to ensure a seamless July 1 transition, when our newest members will be greeted with our trademark professionalism, and the assurance that at First Regional "you get interest on your money, and interest in You."


