





2015 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

ome 350 members attended First Regional's 37th Annual General Meeting (AGM) held at the Jewel Runaway Bay Hotel on Saturday June 13, 2015.

Reviewing First Regional's performance for the year 2014, President Donald Mason said there was a 16% growth in Total Assets which stood at \$3.83 Billion at the end of 2014. He said the Credit Union made a surplus of \$119 Million and Total Comprehensive Income of \$127 million. The President said the Loan portfolio showed a 23% growth of \$419 Million.



Treasurer Leroy Williams, in his presentation, pointed out that at the end of 2014 First Regional's capital adequacy ratio stood at 16.55% - significantly higher than the 8% required by the League and the 6% mandated by the Bank of Jamaica.

Members actively participated,

asking questions, seeking clarification and updates on a variety of matters; and commending members of staff at various branches for their professionalism.



First Regional Co-operative Credit Union has presented three blood pressure machines to the St. Ann's Bay Hospital. The presentation was made at the Credit Union's June 13th AGM, and is consistent with First Regional's commitment to positively impact the island's health sector. Board member, Karen Grant presented the blood pressure machines which were accepted on behalf of the St. Ann's Bay Hospital by its CEO Leo Garel.

Some 1120 high school students participated island wide. First Regional's lectures were conducted by Marketing Manager, Kerry-Ann Gordon at the York Castle High School in Brown's Town, St. Ann, where 32 students required to write essays detailing what they learnt from the programme. The winner received a First Regional gift certificate and a tablet courtesy of JCCUL; while the runners-up were awarded gift certificates from First Regional.

Under the programme, the students learnt that healthy personal finances come as a result of planning and good money management. Other objectives of the Financial Literacy Programme included having students:
